

Attention Bison Shippers – Third Update on Force Majeure Event

This notice is to advise Bison Shippers that the inline inspections (“ILI”) on the section of pipe that was damaged due to a rupture has been completed as of Monday August 22, 2011. The US Department of Transportation’s Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (“PHMSA”) has given Bison permission to return the pipeline to service at a reduced pressure.

At this reduced pressure the Operational Capacity available for Bison’s Shippers will be 230,000 Dth/d. Shipper nominations will be scheduled up to that limited capacity level. Should nominations exceed that level, Bison will make the appropriate reductions based on Section 6.10.5 of its FERC Gas Tariff. With the completion of the pigging operations and PHMSA approval to begin limited operations, beginning Wednesday August 24, 2011 reservation charge credits will only be given for the difference between a shipper’s nominated quantity and the volume scheduled and confirmed by Bison up to the Shipper’s Firm Delivery Quantity pursuant to Section 6.44 of its FERC Gas Tariff.

Bison also advises that until it receives regulatory approval from PHMSA to operate at full capacity, the event of Force Majeure that was claimed in previous postings will remain in effect. Updates regarding Bison’s return to design pressure and capacity will be provided as additional information becomes available.

Thank you for your patience while we make every effort to bring this pipeline back to full capacity.
